### Whole School Exercise- Come and Join Us!! *Wednesday, 16<sup>th</sup> October* (Weather dependant)

Thanks to parental donations and our PTA, we have a magnificent running track that we would like to gain maximum benefit from. Each half term we aim to invite you to arrive at school a little early in order to make use of our running track with your child. On Wednesday, 16<sup>th</sup> October, you are invited to run, walk or jog around the track with your child from **8:40am until 8:50am** when the doors will open for school as normal. Mr Morris will set up some music to increase motivation levels. Your child will still be under your supervision until they come into school at 8:50am. If it is very wet weather we will reschedule to the following Wednesday- 23<sup>rd</sup> October.

### Volunteer Librarian

We are looking for a group of volunteers who would be willing to supervise our library for an hour or two, one morning per week to allow children to choose and return library books. The role would involve helping children to select suitable books and showing them where to put them when they are returned. ### Charity Assembly (2 showings of the same assembly) *Wed 23<sup>rd</sup> October at 2pm & Thurs 24<sup>th</sup> October at 2pm*

Every child will perform in our Charity Assembly, which will be shown twice in order to increase capacity and enable more of you to attend. The theme of our assembly this year will be a traditional harvest festival.

Our chosen charity for 2019, is the Wellspring Children's Medical Centre in Uganda. Two of our parents are involved with this medical centre, which provides health and social care to around half a million children living within a 20 mile radius of the centre. Children are seen in clinics which provide general paediatric health services and immunizations, together with provision for minor injuries. Annual patient throughput is 20,000 children. In addition, a day ward provides care for thousands of children, mostly suffering from malaria. It is certain that this ward alone saves hundreds of young lives each year, malaria being the biggest killer of Ugandan children.

In addition, we encourage children to bring donations for the Warrington Foodbank, which supports people living in poverty in our local town.

Tickets are available for a donation of £2 each for all parents who wish to come and watch. **ALL** ticket and refreshment proceeds will be added to our collection for the Wellspring Children's Medical Centre.

Due to shortage of space in the hall, **tickets are limited to a maximum of 2 tickets per family NOT per performance or per child. Tickets can be purchased via PARENTPAY.**

Coffee, tea and cakes will be served after the assembly until 3.45pm.


