Walton Gardens Cross Country Event



Over the course of our autumn term, two teams of Key Stage 2 runners have competed three times in a cross country event open to all Warrington schools. The children have run in cold, wet and muddy conditions on a Saturday morning; each time giving 100% effort and being determined to win. We are extremely pleased to announce that after all the results have been collated, our boys' team came FIRST and our girls' team came THIRD!! This is a significant achievement considering that there were around 150 runners competing in each race and 22 schools from across Warrington that competed- many of them twice the size of our one form entry school! Also some of our runners had been poorly in the week before the event, but they battled through! I have received the following feedback from the children:

Physical Activity Survey

Thank you to the 80% of our families who completed the Physical Activity Survey handed out at parents evening. As we expected, we have received very positive results, showing us that our children and their families are very active. Here are some of the headlines:

The highest response was from Class F parents, with 83% of their parents replying. Well done and thank you to Class F parents!

Class	Summary
Class F	Class F are most active at the weekends and Monday and Wednesday are their most active days.
Class 1	Class 1 are very active with families at weekends. Monday & Fridays are their least active days out of school.
Class 2	Class 2 have very active family weekends too. Tuesday and Friday are their least active days.
Class 3	Class 3 is very active at the weekend. Monday is their busiest active day (run club!) but Wednesday, Thursday and Friday only a small proportion of them are active out of school.
Class 4	Class 4 are very active at the weekend. Not many do anything on a Friday but all other days most are active (Beavers, Brownies and Cubs were included in the physical activity survey)
Class 5	In Class 5 there is a drop in types of activity done by each child i.e. they begin to specialise by year 5. Again they're active at weekends, not quite as active as other year groups but busier doing more clubs at school than other years. Their least active day is Friday followed by Wednesday.
Class 6	And finally Year 6 are very busy at weekends with lots of sports matches played. They are least active on a Wednesday and Friday.

We will use this information to help us plan our extra-curricular clubs going forwards; on days where children are less active, we will aim to offer a physical activity club. Mrs Lynch has put a lot of time and effort into liaising with club leaders to create extra-curricular club provision at Cherry Tree which caters for everyone's preferences and availability. In the spring term 2020, we have 4 clubs on per night and two new clubs on offer: Confidence Academy and Clay club. The clubs list has been published on ParentApps. Booking will be available on ParentPay next Friday.
