# English Maths

#### **Non-Fiction: Non Chronological Reports**

We will be looking at writing a non-chronological report, learning how to develop the skills of factual report writing and looking at ways to present such reports, including the use of ICT.

#### **Fiction: Stories from other cultures**

We will read/compare two different traditional stories: Hansel & Gretel and Baba Yaga.

The children will write their own narratives and we will focus on using conjunctions, adverbs, adjectives, noun phrases and powerful/interesting verbs.

## Speaking and listening:

Throughout all our English work we will:

- study different spelling patterns
- revise the spelling of high frequency words
- develop our handwriting (learn how to join letters together)
- focus on punctuating our sentences accurately
- focus on grammar

#### Poetry:

We will be exploring different types of riddles (both rhyming and non-rhyming) and discussing what makes a good riddle. The children will write their own riddle about an animal focusing on the use of adverbs, conjunctions and noun phrases.

#### **Fractions:**

Understand terms numerator and denominator. Recognise, find, name and write fractions ½, 1/3, ¼, 2/4 and ¾ (of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity). Recognise equivalent fractions.

#### Measurement:

Choose and use appropriate standard units to estimate and measure length / height / mass / capacity / temperature using rulers, scales, thermometers and measuring vessels. Compare and order measurements. This will be linked to Geography as we will investigate the various climates which Sunny the Meerkat will visit. Tell and write the time to five minutes. Calculate time intervals. Compare and sequence time intervals.

#### **Problem solving:**

Solve both one-step and two-step word problems. Work out which operation they need to use. Use a variety of methods, including column addition and column subtraction.

#### YOUR CHILD'S TARGETS FOR THIS HALF TERM:

#### **Maths**

Working towards – Recognise/find a half or a quarter of a shape/amount.

Expected - Recognise/find a half, a quarter, a third or three quarters of a shape/amount.

Greater depth – Count in fractions and recognise equivalent fractions.

#### Writing

Working towards - Successfully join ideas with 'and' or 'but'.

Expected - Use a good variety of conjunctions to join sentences/sequence ideas.

Greater depth - Use both coordinating and subordinating conjunctions effectively. Start organising writing into paragraphs.

#### Reading

Working towards - Can locate specific information in response to a simple question.

Expected - Responds to main characters, events and settings by making simple inferences about thoughts and feelings.

Greater depth - Explore underlying themes and ideas, making clear reference to text.

#### **HOW YOU CAN HELP AT HOME:**

#### **English**

Read, recite and learn some poems (it is important your child reads poetry with a clear voice and clear pronunciation). Practise reading a poem out loud, using expression to emphasise the meaning. Have a go at writing a poem with your child.

Please keep encouraging your child to read as often as possible.

Handwriting: Please encourage your child to begin to join up/practise joining up. They will be learning/developing this skill in class.

#### **Maths**

Practise times-tables regularly with your child (focus on 2, 5 and 10 times tables). They need to know by heart all multiplication facts AND division facts.
