English	Maths
<p>Writing</p> <p>Narrative Writing a recount. Use a variety of texts as models to help us plan our own recount. Use of planning, drafting and editing work focusing on composing sentences with a rich and varied vocabulary.</p> <p>Poetry Kennings poems.</p> <p>Non-Fiction Instruction writing - use of imperative words and language related to the topic and give detailed, clear instructions.</p> <p>Reading Listen and discuss a wide range of fiction, poetry and non-fiction books. Comprehension skills - Concluding, Summarising and Inferring.</p> <p>Spelling and Grammar Regular spelling lessons throughout the week with a weekly spelling test. Grammar skills- adjectives, adverbs, verbs, conjunctions, prepositions. Correct use of speech marks to show direct speech.</p>	<p>Money Add and subtract amounts of money to give change, using both £ and p in practical contexts.</p> <p>Statistics Interpret and present data using bar charts, pictograms and tables. Solve one-step and two-step questions (for example, 'How many more?' and 'How many fewer?') using information presented in scaled bar charts and pictograms and tables.</p> <p>Fractions Count up and down in tenths; recognise that tenths arise from dividing an object into 10 equal parts and in dividing one-digit numbers or quantities by 10 Recognise and use fractions as numbers: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators. Recognise, find and write fractions of a discrete set of objects: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators. Solve problems that involve all of the above.</p> <p>Length and Perimeter Measure, compare, add and subtract: lengths (m/cm/mm); mass (kg/g); volume/capacity (l/ml). Measure the perimeter of simple 2D shapes.</p>
